We are happy that Mrs. Buist has been back full time for several weeks and has been able to do her work here at ICS fully again.

Some of you will know that my wife and I were away to the United States to a conference last week. From Tuesday till Friday we attended the 2012 National Agriculture in the Schools Conference in Loveland, Colorado. Approximately 450 teachers and ag industry people attended from all over the US. We thoroughly enjoyed the meetings, speeches, workshops and field trips we were busy with all that time. We met many interesting people from many states and collected a lot of resource material which will be useful to our Manitoba Agriculture in the Schools organization. I will share that with them this summer. Thanks very much to the school board for allowing me that time away from school. Also thanks to the staff for keeping the ICS ship running while I was away.

Graduation 2012 is over and congratulations are due to Justin Bakker, Ellen Cavers, Aynsley Kuik, Kylie Kuik, Marina VandenAkker and Alina VanGoor for completing their high school studies at ICS. May God bless each one of you in your future endeavours. If you attended the grad ceremony, you have heard what their plans are for the future.

Our Elementary Closing Assembly took place as well, on Thursday. There, our 23 Kindergarten students looked wonderful with their grad caps and received diplomas from their teacher, Mrs. Nyhof. Mr. Folkerts presented his Grade 6 students with diplomas as well as they will be going “downstairs” to Grade 7 in September. These will be big changes for the K and Grade 6 students and we wish them all the best in their new surroundings in the coming school year.

All of our students have successfully completed their year of study at ICS. That means each one is promoted to a new grade. Sometimes a student does even better than that. That is the case with Grade 1 student, Erin Van Veen. In September she will join the Grade 3 class. Please encourage your children to support her in this big move so that it can be done seamlessly.

Many meetings and hours have been spent in making plans for August and September. The Education Advisory Committee has gone over Parent and Student Handbooks, making adjustments where necessary. One of the big changes for the whole student body (Grades K – 12) is that all students and staff are required to wear tops with sleeves. Any shorts worn to school must be as long as the tips of the students’ fingers when they hold their arms by their sides. Other requirements concerning dress remain as they are published in the Handbooks. *“Clothing must reflect a Christian lifestyle. Clothing inappropriate for school, including beach wear, scrubby or revealing clothing, clothing promoting rock groups, clothing with inappropriate slogans and logos, or alcohol commercials, is not to be worn in or at the school or at school functions. ... Other than earrings in girls, body piercing will not be tolerated. No hat is to be worn in the school at any time.”* Parents, please take this into consideration when you go shopping for new outfits for the new school year. These policies apply to ALL students in Grades K – 12 as well as staff members. We will be enforcing this from the first day of school.

Another thing to remember for students is to purchase and use only scent-free deodorant. Both staff members and students are affected negatively by scents and we need everyone’s cooperation in keeping our environment safe for everyone.

Some classroom assignments will change. The Grade 6 students will be in the present Grade 1 room. Grade 1 will be in the present Grade 5 room and Grade 5 will be in the present Grade 6 room. These changes were made to better accommodate the large Grade 1 class.

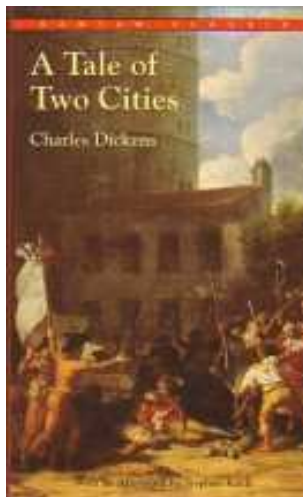

Here's a final Charles Dickens recommendation, one that's even been used as a gripping way to understand the French Revolution in ICS's own Western Civilization course: *A Tale of Two Cities*. It truly shows how, as the book opens, "it was the best of time, it was the worst of times..." Dickens portrays in this novel how the French nobility brought much of the violence that consumed them down on their own heads through their oppression of the lower classes, but also shows how the Revolution was motivated by vindictive vengeance rather than a passion for justice.

We also see how the cruelty in Paris – shown by the calm and triumphant knitting of Madam Defarge while sitting at the foot of the guillotine to watching the executions – was mirrored by the callousness of the ruling classes in London. At the same time, the novel's hero, Sidney Carton, demonstrates the heroism willing to give itself to save the innocent.

From the Library Committee:

We are planning to have a summer reading program in the library again because it was such a success last year!

All books read for this program have to be taken out of the ICS library. We would like for parents to sign off on the reading that their children are doing in log sheets (these will be provided). There will be prizes handed out in September for those who have read for the required time, and additional prizes for those who are the top in each category. The prizes (gift certificates from Hull's Bookstore) for the top two readers in each category will be \$35.00 for 1st and \$25.00 for 2nd. Preschoolers will receive a picture book. All others will receive a \$10.00 certificate for reading the minimum requirement.

You (or your child) can sign up at the library starting July 3, when the library will be opened. The last day to hand in completed sheets will be August 28.

These are the categories for the minimum time required:

Ages 13 – 18 20 hours

Ages 8 – 12 15 hours

Ages 5 – 7 10 hours

Preschoolers (Ages 3 – 4) 10 hours
