## From the Principal – Mr. P.Veenendaal

And of course thanks to all of you who generously filled boxes for children in other parts of the world who have so little. Yes, it is **winter** for sure now and a reminder is in place for all parents to provide their children with toques, mitts and other warm clothing. Elementary students are expected to remain outside until 8:35 in the mornings so it is important that they are properly dressed when they are dropped off in the parking lot. Students without snow pants are not allowed to play on the snowhill. Regular clothing just gets too wet and that creates unpleasant odours in the classroom for the day. Our guidelines for indoor recesses say that students (and staff members) will generally stay indoors if the wind-chill temperatures are -30. We do take general conditions into account when we make final decisions, so trust us to make the proper decisions. Sometimes during the afternoon recesses we will suggest that the older students dress up and spend a few minutes outside even if it is very cold. Most of them welcome those opportunities for some fresh air after a long day in the classroom.

We have been requested to make our gym available for a girls AAA varsity wildcard game between Calvin Christian and Lorette teams. The winner will qualify to represent their school at provincials. 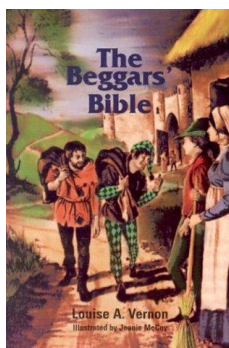

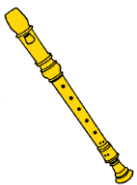

### **Grade 1: Mrs. Heidema**

After various introductory lessons we hope to start with our theme centers group activities. In small groups the students will do various assignments that require the use of all eight different intelligences in turn. This way they can share and expand all their God-given talents. The main theme is 'Making Memories' and the lessons include Social Studies and Science topics. We will be busy with this every afternoon. We are looking forward to it!

**Word Wall Words:** We started with Power Words list 3! The words are: are – at – but – do – eat. Parents, did you find the second Power Words list in the yellow Home Reading folder? It would be a good habit to read the list twice every time you do the Home Reading. You could also hunt for Power Words in the book(s) you are reading. It's fun!

**Letter Work:** The titles of our Pattern Books are, We make a big ..., Come play in the ..., Love is like ... and Here we can ... You can read them when you come for Parent Teacher interviews!

**Math:** We started using our bead racks, which helps to recognize numbers without counting. This involves a lot of talking like, "I see it is six because I see five red and one white bead" or, "I know it is nine because there is one white bead left, and ten take away one equals nine." Some parents wonder if there is anything they could do at home to stimulate the math development of their son/daughter. Counting games is one of the things that support the students' number sense. Count up to 50, to 100, or 120. Count back from 20.

### **Grade 2: Miss Vandermeulen**

**Math:** Unit: Patterns and Relations. We are planning on wrapping up this unit in the coming week by finishing off a few activities, doing some review and writing a test. Our next unit in Math is *Statistics and Probability*.

**Science:** We have wrapped up our unit on nutrition this week and plan to write a test for it at the beginning of next week. After this we will be moving on from Science to Social Studies starting with a unit on *Our Local Community*.

Sentences are to be done for homework on Tuesday evening (Nov. 26).** Basic List: rode, cabin, sail, throat, camp, rope, said, know, boats blow, alone, float, own, closed. Super words: compass, campground, stow, known, rowboat, loneliness.

**6+1 Writing: Conventions-** The writing activities completed this week were for assessment purposes. Next week we will start on our “Trait Crate” activities beginning with Ideas.

**Social Studies:** This week we learned about some aboriginal place names, what they mean, what language they’re from, and located them on a large road map of Manitoba. Mrs. Dykstra read the Legend of the White Horse (found at St. Francois Xavier) while the students listened and illustrated the story. We also sorted some resources the aboriginals used according to their purpose. It was a contest to see which group would get the most right! Next week, we’ll study how they used the bison and hopefully place a summary of this information on our timelines. If all goes according to plan we will learn about the explorers who came too.
