From the Principal – Mr. P.Veenendaal

We have completed our second term for elementary students. Next week is our Spring Break. Enjoy spending some extra time with your children. May you all be kept safe when you travel and we hope to see everyone back again on Monday, April 7. We hope that our snow "mountain" will be shrunk by the time we get back. Regardless, it won't be gone and we will probably have a very wet school yard for quite a while yet. Please have your children dress accordingly. We will also do our best to keep them dry.

Our first week back will be a very busy week. On Tuesday, April 8, students in Grades 7 – 12 will receive their second progress reports for the second semester. As always, contact us if you have any questions about those reports. On Wednesday, April 9, is our Annual Heritage Fair. If you haven't called us yet to volunteer your time to be a judge for that evening, please let us know if you can help out. On Thursday, April 10, parents of Grade 7 – 12 students are invited to attend parent/teacher conferences. 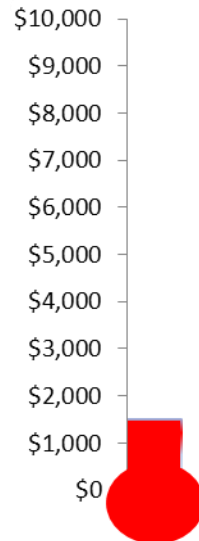

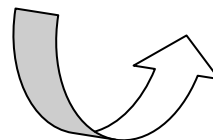

K-6 choir - We continue to learn songs that relate to Good Friday and Easter. This week we had the privilege of having Miss Klos play the piano at our practices. We will have practices in the Gym on Monday, Wednesday and Friday in the week after the break.

Kindergarten - This week we had a choir practice on Monday instead of music class. After the break we will also have choir instead of music.

Grade 1 - We continued with “Bee Bee Bumblebee” and added movement and even instruments to the song. Next time we’ll learn “Bow Wow Wow” and play a partner game.

Grade 2 - We learned “A Sailor went to Sea” and made it a clapping song and added movement. Next time we’ll learn “Rain on the Green Grass” and play a rhythm game.

Grade 3 - We started learning “I love the Mountains” and added movement and body percussion to it. Next time we’ll learn “Rabbits” and create new words to the tune and we’ll learn the difference between the major and minor scale. **Grade 3 Recorder:** The next time is April 23.

Grade 4 - After the break we’ll learn “We’re going on the upward trail” and learn to sing and play the ostinato. **Recorder Grade 4:** The next time we have recorder is April 16.

Grade 5 - After the break we’ll learn “Chumbara” and play a game with different body percussion and later will transfer these to unpitched rhythm instruments.

Grade 6 - After the break we’ll learn “Down in the Jungle” and we’ll work on making it a complete ensemble piece with recorder, pitched and unpitched percussion instruments.

Band 10G – Keep practising your instrument so that we can work on putting it together rather than learning the notes. Remember to hand in your Personal Information forms.

Band 40S - We continue to play through the music selections, we pick up on things like balance, rhythm and dynamics. Remember to hand in your Personal Information forms.

Even though this week was filled with fun and interesting activities the highlight was our Assembly on Wednesday. It was Grade One's turn to host and present the monthly assembly and the theme was Proclaim and Praise. Some students drew fitting pictures for the slide show, others wrote a prayer together and everyone took turns presenting by

speaking in the microphone. The students practiced well in advance and took their tasks seriously. The result was a well-presented assembly that was enjoyed by the K-6 audience. We may praise God for this!

On another note, most parents know that in Grade 1 the students may use tools that help them pay attention. Think of a hand tool (squishy ball, bean bag), a body tool (a ball, balance cushion or special stool to sit on), or an ear tool like ear muffs. The students make use of these tools responsibly. We also use mouth tools. It is

better to chew on something age-appropriate than on your shirt sleeve or collar. Just last week one student received a new chew tool and diligently kept it on the name tag when not in



use. Unfortunately the chewing bracelet disappeared overnight last Thursday. Do any of the school cleaners know where it went? I am asking because this so-called "Chewlery" does not come cheap. The picture shows what it looks like. The colour is white. Thanks in advance!

We finished the last week before Spring Break. The students worked well enough and they are ready for a break. We wish you all a restful time, whatever you are hoping to do. May we see one another again in good health!

Memory Work: Song: H 42:1 (due Friday April 11); Text: Philippians 4:12b-13 (due Thursday April 17)

Bible: The students were very interested to learn about the Cycle of the Judges: Obedience to God – Idolatry – God sends enemies – Repentance and cry for help – Salvation. Some students could not understand why the people would turn away from God time and again for, "They know it is wrong!" We discussed how this is sin and that we are no better than the Israelites: every time you make a poor choice and hit someone who hits you, you sin again even though you know it is wrong! This of course is a hard concept for these young children, but still an important life-lesson to learn. After the break we will learn about Gideon and Samson.

Word Wall Words: You might have seen that the students took home a pretest last Monday.

Every new week we will do a pretest and send it home the same day. That way you can see which words need some more practice before we do the final test on Friday. Please make sure you don't forget about previous words once we move on to the next list! Every test will contain some words of previous lists. Next week we will practice the spelling of the words in the third column of List 1: in – is – it – look – love – make.

Letter Work: We will meet Old Joe Crow who makes the /ow/ sound spelled like ow, oa, oe, o_e and ol. Then we will contrast his sound with Dr. Ollie Ostrich's short /o/ sound.

Grade 5: Miss Mans

Spring Break arrives! I hope everyone has a wonderful week ☺

The students have been working very diligently on their Heritage Fair projects. Over the Spring Break they will have to put the finishing touches on their backboard and brainstorm some "speech" ideas.

Parents, you may have noticed a change in our Spelling checklists. There is no division of the work. This means the students need to manage their time wisely, scheduling it out themselves. Please continue to encourage them to complete their work *before* the due date and keep in mind what evenings and days tend to be busier.

Patrols: Week of April 7: Jordan V. Naomi, Summer

Memory Work: *Song:* Hymn 2:3 *memorize:* Apostle's Creed

Church History: We are discussing terms such as racism and learning how they tie into our previously known terms: prejudice and discrimination. We are learning how these exist because of the fall into sin. This can be seen in the slave trade, the treatment of First Nations tribes, and also in the Holocaust.

Heritage Fair: When the students come back from break they should have completed their:

- Backboard (content, pictures, background etc.)
- Good Copy Report (includes: Title Page, Table of Contents, page numbers, and possible appendix) – should be edited by an adult
- Display ideas (props, technologically based materials etc.)
- Brainstorming for their oral presentation (2-3min about their project)

Be prepared to come to school and practice your presentations for the Heritage Fair taking place on Wednesday April 9.

Math: We have learned about capacity, studying L and mL. The students have learned how to estimate capacities using referents. After the break we will be studying the relationship between capacity and volume.

Social Studies: After our Heritage Fair is wrapped up we will be learning about the change in Women's Rights and the Great Depression.

Important Information on Measles for Manitoba Parents/Guardians

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Two confirmed cases of measles have been identified in Manitoba. There have also been recent outbreaks of measles in other parts of Canada, including a current outbreak in British Columbia where there are over 200 cases.

Measles is an extremely contagious illness, spread easily through the air. The best way to protect your child (aged one to seventeen years of age) from measles is to make sure that your child is up to date with his/her measles immunizations, which are provided free-of-charge by your immunization provider (physician, nurse practitioner, or local public health unit).

If your child is not up to date with his/her measles immunizations and is exposed to a case of measles in his/her school or child care facility, you may be asked by public health or your child's school or child care facility to keep your child home for up to three weeks to prevent infection and ensure his/her safety as well the safety of his/her peers. You do not have to keep your child home at this time **unless** they are showing symptoms of measles, as described below.

Signs and symptoms of measles infection include:

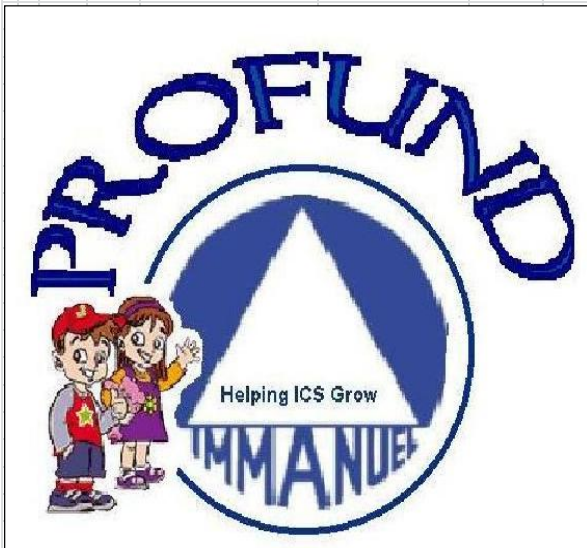
- Fever 38.3C or higher
- Cough, runny nose or red eyes
- Red blotchy rash appearing 3-7 days after the fever starts, beginning on the face and spreading down the body

If you or your child has all of the symptoms above, please keep your child home from his/her school or child care facility. Contacting Health Links-Info Santé or your primary health care provider can help you in determining whether you or your child should receive further assessment and if that is needed, what accommodations can be put in place **PRIOR** to your visit to minimize contact with other patients. Many viral infections can have similar signs and symptoms, and measles remains extremely rare in Manitoba.
