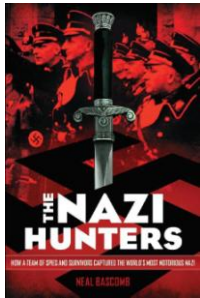

Grade 1: Mrs. Heidema

Did you know that Mr. Baker is a great Grade 1 Science teacher? In class we read a book about a boy who had a microscope and then Mr. Baker gave us a chance to use microscopes in his High School classroom! On Monday we all

went downstairs to find sixteen microscopes all set up with interesting things, like sugar, salt, a coin, a pop tab, but also a butterfly’s wing, a fish scale or a grasshopper’s leg. For half an hour the students enthusiastically explored everything, also with a magnifying glass. Thank you Mr. Baker, that was wonderful!

The rest of the week was warm, sometimes tiring, but also enjoyable. The students are encouraged to bring along a water bottle. Extra bathroom visits are allowed, as long as they first of all use the bathroom at the appropriate times (read: recess time...).

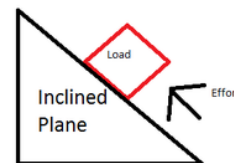
Spelling: Lesson 30 – Looking Back. Remember to make all corrections from previous lessons. Write list words in alphabetical order.

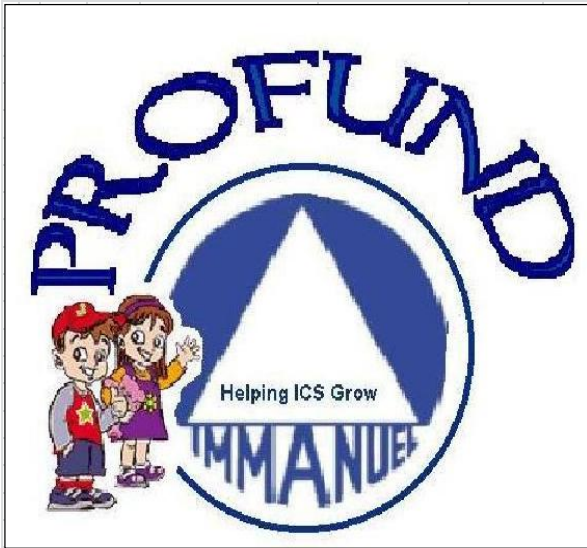

GENERAL INFORMATION for Parents and Students

RE: June 2014 Exams

1. The exam schedule has been posted in the Messenger. All exams will be written in the gym, with the exception of Data Collection 35S, which will be written in the Computer Room. Regardless of the location, students must be in the exam locale at 9:00 for devotions and announcements. Exams begin at 9:10 A.M.
2. All exams for students are 2 hours in duration, with the exception of 40S courses which are 2.5 hours in duration. Students must remain in the gym until one hour has elapsed.
3. If a student is unable to write an exam, the principal must be notified **BEFORE** the exam by the parent or guardian. A doctor's certificate may be required upon request of the school.
4. No books, notes or electronic devices are allowed in the gym when students are writing exams. Electronic devices (cell phones, etc.) must be left in student lockers or submitted to supervising teachers before the exam time.
5. All textbooks related to the course must be returned to the subject teacher **on the day of the final exam**. Students will be assessed and billed for damage beyond reasonable wear and tear, as well as for books which are lost.
6. Bring necessary writing equipment, calculators, math sets.
7. Marks **WILL NOT be released** to the students until **ALL** their exams have been written. The students may view their exams on Wednesday, June 25, 2014. **No marks will be released to grade 12 students until Wednesday, June 25, 2014.**
8. Final exams for semestered courses are worth 30% of the final grade; mid-term exams and final exams for non-semestered courses are worth 15%.

 - a. Think of questions and answer them.
 - b. Highlight important items in your notes.
 - c. Memorize important facts (create lists), equations, etc.

 - e. reread your exam before you hand it in filling in those blanks that you left earlier;
 - f. after completing the exam, write on the exam the time required for you to finish the exam.
 - i. [Do not include time you spend checking over the exam].
