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From the Board

Annual Membership Meeting

The Board thanks all those who attended the membership meeting on November 30th. Your presence and engagement at these meetings is encouraging and uplifting to the Board, Administration and staff.

There has been an increase in requests to livestream the membership meetings for the benefit of those who, for a variety of reasons, are not able to attend. These meetings are considered private, the content of which is intended only for the members of the Society and not the general public. Further, considering the sometimes sensitive nature of material discussed at these meetings, it is wise to be discreet in how the information is disseminated. Open access to livestream viewing could potentially result in information being shared or interpreted in a negative way, with or by an unfamiliar person or group of people. Password-required log-ins could be considered, but at this time the Board has determined this to be an unnecessary encumbrance to the meeting plans and organization. We respectfully ask that you continue to strive to go to the meetings, with the hope being that at least one representative of each family is able to attend.

At this meeting the aDVance Fundraising Committee shared that approximately forty percent of the community had taken time to submit a donation or pledge form, with pledged contributions reaching an approximate 1.8 million dollars over the next eight years. Thank you!! And thank you to all those who are prayerfully striving to determine how best they can practically support the expansion and growth of Immanuel Christian School.

After the meeting, some members expressed curiosity and interest in the recent work of the aDVance Committee in locating a new property. Be assured, this committee continues its work. Though there is nothing "exciting" to report to date, it can be shared that several properties have been investigated and deemed unsuitable due to both price and location (primarily). The committee recently met with a developer with whom it was put into contact by MLA Mr. James Teitsma and City Councillor Mr. Russ Wyatt. This meeting went well, and options are being investigated. The committee continues to communicate with various city planners, and to research zoning, servicing and development options on other properties. Your continued communication with the committee is appreciated!


SPORTS CORNER:

Going farther... in our school library

If you've ever read Robinson Crusoe (or tried to read it but found it heavy going), then you may want to try the more adventurous sequel, Daniel Defoe's *The Farther* Adventures of Robinson Crusoe - another of the new novels available for Grades 7 and 8. Robinson Crusoe tells the story of his adventures back on his old island, and in China and Russia – facing a mutiny, a civil war, bandits, and idol-worshippers – and showing us the end of Crusoe's faithful servant Friday.

Woodcut illustrations and notes from the editor make the story clearer for readers from young to old.

Remember a <u>scholarship</u> is usually based on academic performance, leadership, and community involvement, or other factors, whereas a <u>bursary</u> is based on financial need. MUSIC NOTES!

Term of the Week: "The Twins and The Monster" is the title of the WSO *Musical Discoveries* program geared toward grade 1-3. It is based on a traditional South African tale and retold by author Tololwa Mollel. The adaptation for orchestra was written by Doug McKeag, with the score composed by John Estacio. Next time I will tell you more about the story.



Kindergarten: Mrs. Nyhof: The Christmas program is behind us and we look forward to having regular music class again. We will learn 2 new songs ("Shape Song" & "Hey, Hey Look at Me") and learn the scale of low to high notes using our bodies.

Grade 1-3: After the break we will start listening to preparing for the WSO performance. The first theme is the *Forest Theme*. This lesson will focus on the mood of the piece through creative art and movement. **Permission click for WSO will be going out early in the New Year**.

Grade 4: On Tuesday, January 16 we will learn *Jolly Jolly Rhythm* and focus on solo singing. We will also learn accompaniment that focuses on call and respond.

Grade 5: After the break we will learn *Ickle Ockle*. We will review beat and rhythm, sing the song in solfege, and learn to improvise using different rhythms. We will also learn accompaniment.

Grade 6: In the New Year we will start with a round *Now We'll Make the Rafters Ring* to work on our singing. We will also listen to *Cello Suite No. 3 in C major* by Johann Sebastian Bach. We'll use this to learn about his life and to identify the elements of music such as melody, texture, beat and rhythm, tempo, dynamics, and form.

Band 8-10: After the Christmas break we will start working on pieces for the Spring Program. We will focus on technique, theory and history.
