FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

Last weekend was a busy sports weekend for ICS. The Junior girls were at a tournament at Linden Christian School while both the Varsity Girls and Boys teams had the opportunity to play in a Provincials qualifying tournament. Congratulations to the boys team for qualifying for Provincials! They will be competing in the Provincial AA Varsity Boys Provincial Championships in Warren. It is a significant time commitment and your willingness to serve is very much appreciated. The end of volleyball for most teams means a short break for families before basketball gets up and running sometime in December.

This past week we had some classes out for field trips.

While the short volunteer time given does not have a significant impact, the trip combined with readings and discussions in class help to open students' eyes to the circumstances of those less fortunate and perhaps open opportunities for future volunteering.

This coming week we have a few events going on at the school.

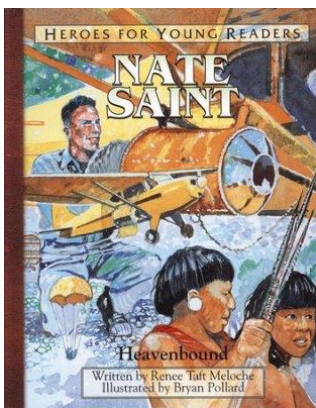

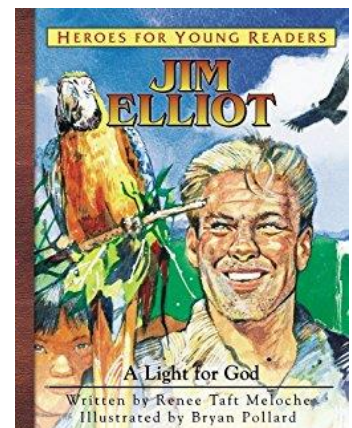

SPORTS CORNER:

Volleyball . . .

- Last weekend several of our volleyball teams participated in tournaments. Our Junior Girls had their final tournament of the year at Linden. They finished 3rd out of the 5 teams there. Congratulations on a good season, ladies, and thanks again to the coaches Gillian VanderVegte, Scott VanderVegte, and Cayle Lutz for their work with the girls.
- The Varsity Girls participated in the provincial qualifying tournament at Niverville. Although they came in ranked #16 and had to play the #1, 8 and 9 ranked teams, the girls had some close matches, even beating the #8 ranked team in 3 sets. Unfortunately, due to the sets won/lost tiebreaker, the girls did not make the playoffs, and thus did not qualify for provincials. Thanks to the coaches Peter deBoer and Teresa Felske for their work with the girls again this year.
- The Varsity Boys' also participated in a provincial qualifying tournament. They were ranked #10, and were in a pool with the #2 and #7 ranked teams. They lost to #2 Green Valley, but then defeated #7 ranked Carberry in their second game. That put them into 2nd place in their pool, and had to play the 3rd place team in the opposite pool, Lac du Bonnet. The guys had played Lac du Bonnet twice this season, and split the two games. This would be the rubber match. Lac du Bonnet won the first set, then the guys took the second. In the third set they were down 10-4, and then 14-10 (with the set going to 15 points). The guys did not give up, and with tremendous support from the many fans ended up taking the set 16-14 and qualified for provincials. These provincials are in Warren next weekend. If you are interested, the games will be streamed online. Go to www.mhsaa.ca, click on the provincials tab, then on the AA Varsity Boys and Girls tab. Click on the boys tab, then on live feed.
- For the rest of the athletes there is a bit of a break until basketball practices start up. We hope to begin these either the first or second week of December.

It was wonderful that most of our students who were sick are feeling better. We continue to miss those who are away. It is important to continue to send appropriate winter gear for the weather that we have been having. Thank you for being so faithful in doing this! It is also especially important in wet weather to have an extra pair of socks at school. Please continue to keep a pair in your child's backpack throughout the winter as they can be needed often. We do have a few pairs in the classroom but they get used up quickly. If your child comes home with a pair that is not their own, please wash them and send back so that we can continue to have a supply here.

This week we celebrated making it halfway to 100 day! The students are already discussing which 100 items they hope to bring when the Lord willing we celebrate 100 day late in February. We continue to work with our number of the day throughout the week. Students are learning to count on and back from that number as well as knowing what is one less and one more. Please continue to practice counting activities at home. Students should be familiar with counting by 1s, 2s, 5s, and 10s to 100. Some of the students have had a chance to take home the estimation book that we made. Each student will have a turn to share the book with their family. Please take this opportunity to practice this skill and to enjoy their hard work. We are also nearly finished publishing our book of journal entries which we will also be sending home with one student each day. Please return the books each day.

Show and Tell: M. Kieran, Kyla; **T.** Landon, Levi; **W.** Marissa, Megan; **Th.** Natasha, Nathan

Memory Work: Song: Psalm 99:2 (due Friday December 1); Text: No text until the New Year. We will work on learning the recitations for the Christmas Program in class.

Bible: M. Joseph in jail (Genesis 39: 21- 40:23); T. The dreams of Pharaoh (Genesis 41); W. The brothers' first journey to Egypt (Genesis 42); Th. Second trip of the brothers to Egypt (Genesis 43), F. Joseph reveals himself to his brothers (Genesis 44:1-46:7, 46:28-34, 47: 27-31).

Word Wall Words: We have now begun to learn words from Power Words 3. The words for this week are: **eat, four, fun, good, has.** Please review these regularly. If your child has learned all of the ones taught this year, they already have more than 50 words that they can read without sounding them out. This goes a long way in their confidence when reading. It is also fun to search for these words when you are reading to them. Many of the students are excellent at this.

Letter Work: This coming week we will talk about three long vowel sounds: Ike's Night Bike Ride, Old Joe Crow, and Huey the Mule. When we have been doing dictations for these long vowels we have been focusing on the common vowel, consonant, e spelling of the words and having the students try to spell the whole word. Although it is wonderful that many students are able to spell the entire word correctly this is beyond what is expected for this time in Grade One. We encourage students to use beginning and ending sounds and at least one middle sound (usually a vowel) for the words they spell.



Gym: We continued to practice different ways to throw and catch a ball this past week. The students enjoyed aiming at targets including bowling pins.

Theme Centers: Thank you for completing the survey about your daughter/son. We will use these and the ones they filled in themselves to determine their areas of strength and areas where growth is needed. This will help the students to set goals for themselves as well as to see how they can contribute to the classroom in various

ways. We as teachers also will use this to help us from time to time when we make groups to pair students with others who may work well together and at other times to challenge them to work with those who see things differently. We also learned what kinds of jobs people with various 'smarts' may be good at. This week we will talk about how we can help others who may have a disability in a certain area. We will also read books about children with disabilities to help us understand how we can all contribute.

Word Wall Words – favourite, have, played, stop, gym (test Dec.1).

Memory Work: We will be practising for the Christmas program. **Text:** Galatians 4:4-5

Bible/Church History: We have finished our Church History unit and we have begun our Bible unit. As we are approaching the Christmas season students are excited to be studying about Jesus' birth and early ministry.

ELA: This week students learned it is important for their stories to be in order for them to make sense, or else monkeys at the zoo would taste sooo yummy!

Math: Students continue to investigate different ways to measure. The focus continues to be on using a scale to compare the weight/mass off various items.

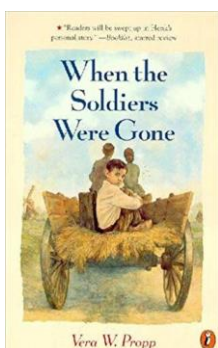
Word Wall Words: everybody, everything, hidden, our, right

our work in math notebooks and have been getting better at writing numbers clearly and accurately using the column method to practice regrouping. We are also continuing with our mental math strategies practice and have worked on Friends of 10, Doubles plus 1 or 2, and Add 9 or 8.

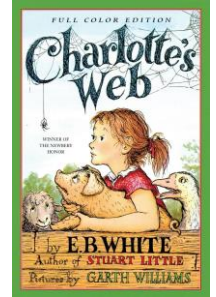

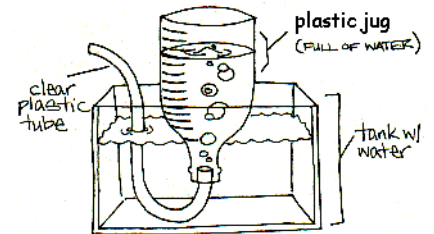

Bible History: Presently we're studying the birth of John the Baptist.

Science 5/6: This week students tested their lung capacity and hypothesized possible reasons for differences between one another. Next we'll study the circulatory system.

Math: This week we started our unit on decimals. Students will begin by learning how to read and write decimals into the millionths.

They read about Theo the Knight, the equipment he used, and the battles he fought. We made a small start in the writing lessons which gave tips on how to maintain your focus in a composition. On Thursday they revised and published a piece of writing. I'm curious to see the results. Next week we'll begin our first novel study on Elizabeth Speare's book *The Bronze Bow*.

Students will be instructed on how to write a response journal. We'll continue with writing workshops that teach how to maintain your focus in a composition. Word Work will include Lesson 10 in Spelling and the use of commas in an address. Remember, Library is on Tuesday!

HIGH SCHOOL DIVISION:

AICT 15 gr 9: There will be a chapter three test on Thursday.

Careers 9: This week students read and analyzed an article which addressed the importance of being punctual. Since I was away on Thursday, students were given the class to finish revising their AEPs and resumes, and prepare the title pages for their portfolios. All of these should be done for Monday, Nov 27. Then we'll begin our last topic: Handling Stress in the Workplace". Students will write a test on Unit 1- Personal Management this Friday, Dec 1.

Math 10F gr 9: Tues. – QUIZ on Solving Equations Involving Fractions and Brackets; Fri.– QUIZ on Solving Linear Inequalities(Chapter 6).
